8pm Wednesday November 15th 2017 – Internet resources and usage for AV Producers

The Internet is the largest and most accessible resource for Audio Visual producers seeking everything from inspiration through to 'how do I do such and such ??'. With the Club's new internet connection for our iMac computer we are going to 'surf the net' and show AV software resources and where to find audio visual inspiration and answers to your AV production questions.

Audio Visual producers need an extensive range of software packages for dealing with sound recording and editing, microphone techniques, obtaining back-ground music and merging-in sound effects etc. The taking and editing photographic images is taken for granted because most of us have a grounding in Camera Club photography. But there are other skills like script writing and visual story-boarding that are also helpful in the AV production and design processes. With the allowance of 20% video in all categories of our APS national audio visual rules there is another area of video taking and movie software usage that AV producers may consider that they need to gain some experience with.

The wide range of editing and production Audio Visual software is intimidating for experienced let alone those just starting out on their first AV project. Experienced mentors in our AV Group can assist you however often, if you are like me, you will require information during the 'wee small hours' and the internet is a great research resource if you know how. We will explore what's and where's on the Internet. Bring along your favorite URLs for assisting you in your AV designs and productions. News from PhotoDEX - first upgrade to new version 9 of Proshow GOLD & PRODUCER

PhotoDEX has announced a new build version 3782. This has been made available for download to upgrade the original release of version 9.0.3769 My recent experience is that there are still audio bugs but it could be new audio processes and sync' procedures that are needed to be used more frequently?

It's ProShow's 15th birthday - 15 years ago in 2002 it was launched - one of the first and only software programs for creating quality audio visual shows on the PC-Windows platform. Still one of the best around.

ProShow 9 version checking for up-upgrades to older licensed versions. If you have purchased Proshow Gold or Producer in the last 12 months you should be able to upgrade to version 9 (download) at no cost. Subsequent releases will also be free for 12 months.

This presentation event has become annual event for AVG members to present the best of their years AV productions at a General Meeting of the Club. A selection of AVs will be based upon the 10 entries for the End of Year AV competition for spanning an hour and a quarter in projection time. The AVG committee will be in contact with all of this years AV producers to finalise a running sheet and presentation arrangements for the Thursday December 7th evening.

APS Autumn National AV competition rules 'adjusted 4 Video' in 2018

The Australian Photographic Society's national Audio Visual rules have been 'adjusted'. The 5th entry category of 'Fusion' has now been deleted and a 20% max video allowance been inserted in the remaining 4 categories – '*...The video content must not be more than 20% of the duration of the whole sequence. Any combination of text, narration, music and sound effects may be used...*' see the APS definitions on the AV Division's web page at <http://a-p-s.org.au/index.php/av-definitions>

The application to MCC End of Year AV rules and more widely the VAPS Interclub AV rules is a reasonable question on the potential roll-on effect of this maximum 20% Video allowance in all APS National AV Category definitions – Documentary, Theme, Poetry & Song, Photo Harmony. The VAPS AV Committee is currently formulating revised VAPS Interclub AV rules following the circulation of an extensive AV rule change options discussion paper. One of the effects of the almost certain change to the inclusion of a maximum percentage of video will be on the AV judging process. The deadline for consideration of the recommended VAPS Interclub AV rule changes is the November 19th 2017 AGM with the alterations hopefully coming into effect immediately for the 2018 VAPS Interclub. It is important to note that if you produce an AV under the 'former' VAPS AV rules your AV will still comply with any new proposed changes to the new VAPS Interclub AV rules.

Challenge 321 International Audiovisual Contest

Tell your story in 3 Minutes and 21 Seconds

The 321 International Challenge competition will take place again in 2018. A complete revised set of the rules will be published on the web site soon. They will be nearly identical as in 2017.

Main rules for 2018 are (you need to read last years rules from the web site) :

- The maximum runtime is 3 Minutes and 21 Seconds
- AV submissions created in 2016 or later
- Every genre is accepted, but the submissions regarding design, idea, story or originality and should have a certain quality claim.
- Possibly a pre-selection will be made

Closing date: 31 March 2018

Distribution: 15 April 2018

End of judging: 15 June 2018

Publishing of total ranking: 30 June 2018

Ideas and suggestions for 2018 Audio Visual Group Syllabus & AV participation projects

Just a reminder that ideas and suggestions are needed for next year's AVG syllabus and activities. At a recent AVG meeting the idea was floated of having one or two AV challenges put up on our MCC AVG Web Site for downloading and trialing AV productions ?

Idea 1: a sort piece of royalty free music is selected by the AVG committee and put on the AVG web site for downloading. The idea being that it is download and then listened to for construction of an image shooting script of ideas to be photographed and then put together with AV software to 'illustrate' the music.

Idea 2: Similar to idea one above but starts with a set of about 10 related images plus 10 unrelated but similar themed images that can be downloaded from the AVG web site. The challenge is to storyboard an idea from the order of the images and then produce an audio visual with an audio component (music?, sound effects?, narration?) to finally glue and illustrate the story in an AV production.

All are invited to review and comment on these two ideas. You may have other ways to provide a helping hand for members starting out in AVs and a challenge for older experienced AVG members ?

New Distortion effect, Rhythm Track (was called Click Track) and Sample Data Import (thanks to Steve Daulton). Also effects are no longer grayed-out when in pause.

New scrub ruler and 'pinned' option so the waveform moves and the recording/playing head stays still.

New features in Timer Record

On Mac, audacity.app is now added to /Applications/ directly rather than adding a folder there.

64 bugs/annoyances in 2.1.2 fixed of which 15 were long-standing issues. Also lots done to systematically deal with memory leaks.
